## GENERAL INFORMATION ON CHILD AND YOUNG ADULT LANGUAGE PROGRAMS:

### CURRICULUM OVERVIEW:

We use an activities based approach to teaching language that includes songs, music, games, visual and dramatic arts and sports, all of which emphasize oral and listening communication, development of vocabulary, and correct pronunciation. Reading and writing exercises are also included in the instruction where appropriate. The students learn about cultural aspects the language and often have the opportunity to interact with visitors from other countries and expand their global awareness.

### FORMAT:

- Family programs, Language Clubs and Teen classes are usually organized in quarterly sessions that meet once per week for 1.5 hours.
- Family programs are intended for multi-generational attendance; preschool-age children, with an adult family member and other siblings can attend together. These are available as ongoing programs, weekend mini-camps and summer immersion camps.
- Language Clubs for elementary to middle school age children are usually staged after school or on Saturday mornings.

### Young Adult Classes:

- Middle school and high school students enrolled in this program can receive a high school foreign language credit. These are usually year-long programs that meet a minimum of twice a week for 1.5 hours per session.

### Summer Language Immersion Camps – week long day camps:

- For Parents & Preschoolers For Children 7 to 14 years\*  
\*Older students can apply for counselor in training positions

### INSTRUCTORS:

- Our instructors are native speakers (or equivalent) who bring both linguistic and cultural expertise to the classroom. They are enthusiastic and engaging professionals that make language come alive. Instruction is always tailored to meet the needs of the individuals in the group.

### REGISTRATION, TUITION AND FEES:

- Most group classes are offered in 10 to 12 week sessions, and meet once a week for 1 1/2 hours.
- Tuition averages \$25 per class. We require pre-registration and pre-payment for each session. There is a non-refundable \$50 registration fee, which is applied to the tuition.
- Early enrollments – one month prior to start date of any class - receive 10% off tuition.
- We offer a variety of discounts – for siblings and family groups, as well as payment plans. We also have a limited scholarship fund available. We welcome your contributions and inquiries.

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
